SETTING UP FAMILY SHARING

Family Sharing is the only way you can set up your child's iPad for students under the age of 13 years.

Family Sharing allows you to only pay for Apps purchased once and share them among other family members.

Apple (133 622) can assist you over the phone or you can arrange a time to go into your closest Apple store if you have any difficulties setting up Family Sharing.



Family Sharing. Share your favorite things with your favorite people.

Family Sharing lets you and up to five other family members share access to amazing Apple services like Apple Music, Apple TV+, Apple News+, Apple Arcade, and Apple Card.¹ Your group can also share iTunes, Apple Books, and App Store purchases, an iCloud storage plan, and a family photo album. You can even help locate each other's missing devices.

QUICK START: SETTING UP THE IPAD - *Tick off as you complete*

Renaming the Device

Name your child's iPad with their name and class e.g. John C Year 4A

Settings > General > About > Name

Also, ensure your child's name is on the outside of the case.

Turn off – Background App Refresh

This feature allows the iPad to continue working on Apps in the background but this slows down the device. We find it best to turn off the feature for the best efficiency.

Settings > General > Background App Refresh (Slide to grey = off)

Enable AirDrop

Students will use AirDrop in class to send and receive work.

Settings > General > AirDrop > Everyone

Add a lock screen passcode

All BYOD iPads must have a lock screen passcode. It is advisable that parents know the passcode in the event that students forget it. The lock code should not be shared with other students or any school staff.

Settings > Touch ID & Passcode

Add a lock screen photo

Please add a photo of your child to the "lock screen" of your child's iPad so it is easily identified if left unattended. Please note that some teachers may choose to alter the Lock Screen photo at a later date.

Adding a photo to the Lock Screen:

1. **Take a photo of your child using the Camera App**
 2. **Tap the "Settings" icon on your iPad's Home screen to launch the Settings App**
 3. **Tap "Wallpaper" and then tap "Choose a new wallpaper"**
 4. **Browse and select the photo of your child**
 5. **Select "Select Set Lock Screen"**
 6. **Close the Settings App.**

Disable iCloud photo

iCloud cannot be used in Education Queensland schools.

Settings > Photos > iCloud Photos (slide to grey = off)





Enable – predictive text

This feature allows the iPad to generate text predictions based on the words around the text. It is a great way to support spelling because students see correctly spelt words rather than incorrect ones and also saves a lot of time.

Settings > General > Keyboards > Predictive

Set your iPad language to English

Settings > General > Language & Region > iPad Language – English

Enable – Speak Selection

This supports students by allowing the device to read words aloud that they may not know.

Settings > Accessibility > Spoken Content > Speak Selection (slide to green = on)

Apple ID

This is mandatory that the iPad is set up using your child's own Apple ID. This is established through the **Family Sharing** set-up. Please do not use a parent Apple ID if the device is shared.

Enable Multi-tasking Gestures

This allows for various gestures and extra functionality of the iPad.

Settings > Home Screen & Dock > Multitasking > Allow Multiple Apps and Gestures (set each function to green)

Enable - Dictation

This feature allows spoken words to be converted to written text.

Settings > General > Keyboards > Enable Dictation

Enable – Dictionary

This allows the built-in dictionary to give definitions of words.

BYO iPad FAQs

Q. Why is Gilston State School implementing **Voluntary BYO iPad for 2022?**

A: To facilitate development of knowledge and skills necessary for the 21st Century workforce. To meet the demands of the Australian Curriculum; ICT General Capabilities and Technology Key Learning Area, allowing our students further access to technology to support their learning.

Q: Why allow only BYO iPads and no other mobile devices or laptops?

A: We believe in a consistent approach to ensure best productivity to maximise student learning outcomes and to provide adequate technical support to students, parents and teachers.

Q: In 2022, will there be iPad and non-iPad classes?

A: No. Gilston State School has removed iPad classes and devices will not influence class structures. Gilston is inclusive and students without a device will use school-based devices as a learning tool when the teacher deems this appropriate. These devices may not be available on a one-to-one ratio and cannot be taken home.

Q: How much of the day will the iPads be used? Will the students still be using pencil and paper as well as handwriting?

A: The amount of time that students will spend on their iPad will vary depending on learning needs and task requirements. Teachers will always choose the best tool for the task and ensure that devices are used for educational purposes. Yes, students will continue to use pencil and paper to develop their fine motor skills.

Q: How will teachers monitor what my child is accessing on their iPad?

A: At school, students must agree to follow the 'Acceptable Use of the Department's Information, Communication and Technology (ICT) Network and Systems' in relation to Internet Use. 'Students also agree to follow Student Owned Device User Agreement.'

'Apple Classroom' monitoring app will be installed on all teacher iPads. Teachers create a 'classroom' on their iPad and enrol all student devices. This gives teachers control of every iPad- they can view and lock screens; mute devices; share documents; launch websites. This monitoring system disables when students are out of range and teachers cannot monitor iPads when students are at home.



Q: Will the iPads be managed at home or at school? (e.g. loading apps, updating the device, charging the device)

A: Student iPads will need to be managed at home. A list of required apps will be provided and with the support of our Computer Technician, iPads will be set-up in the classroom. Students will be responsible for charging their iPads at home prior to bringing them to school each day.

Q: What IT support will there be?

A: Class teachers will assist where they can and where time allows more expert assistance will be available through the technical support team where they will GUIDE students through technical problems. The technical support team will not handle iPads but guide students through troubleshooting. If the problem is unable to be rectified at school, students will receive communication via the Team, recommending steps/actions to take.

Q: Are the iPads locked up at school?

A: iPads will be stored in classrooms during class time and at break times. iPads must remain in school bags and not be used by students in the playground, before school or after school.

While BYO iPads will be stored securely during class and break times, parents are encouraged to seek personal insurance or Accidental Damage Protection. Options can be explored through Apple Care, preferred insurance companies and iPad retailers.

Q: Are the iPads insured by the school?

A: No. Parents are encouraged to seek personal insurance (or Apple Care via Apple). Check with your preferred insurance company about your personal insurance at home and, to and from school.

Q: What happens if my child's iPad is damaged at school?

A: All devices are monitored by teachers at school and rules are in place to prevent foreseeable problems and damage. However, from time to time, accidents may occur. If any damage to a device is through negligence of the school, the school will cover the cost of repair. If damage is caused by deliberate or careless actions of a student (owner or others), the costs of repair will be passed onto those involved and necessary behaviour consequences may apply. The decision around the responsibility for repair costs is at the discretion of the Principal.



Q: What type of headphones can children use?

A: Book packs come with overhead headphones that can be used with the iPad and on school computers. It is at the discretion of parents if alternative overhead headphones are to be used.

Q: Will students continue to have access to computers and other technologies?

A: Yes. All students at Gilston SS will continue to have access to computers, Technology lessons and teachers will have the option to book the whole-class computer labs.

Q: Does my child need a 3G, 4G or 5G enabled iPad for school?

A: No. Student devices must only access the internet through our secure, wireless network to ensure they are working through Education Queensland Internet filters. If students own cellular iPads, we request that SIM cards are removed when the iPads are at school.

Q: Is my child required to know our Apple ID and password?

A: No. Students should use their own Apple ID as set up through Family Sharing. The parent account should not be used on a BYO iPad

Student Owned Device User Agreement

General Use

1. I understand that I can bring my personal iPad to school each day.
2. I will ensure the device is charged and ready to use at the beginning of each school day.
3. I will ensure that my iPad is in good repair. Any damages will be reported to my teacher and my parents and I will refrain from using it until it is repaired by an external agency.
4. I will hold the device with two hands when carrying it and will walk with it at all times.
5. I will not allow any other student to handle my iPad at any time.
6. I will ensure my device is kept in my school bag on my trip to and from school.
7. I will keep food and drinks away from my device at school.
8. I will immediately report any accidents or breakages to my parents and teachers.
9. I will seek permission from individuals prior to taking photos and recording sound or video.
10. I will follow all staff directions in relation to the use of my device.
11. I understand that I have been asked to take out personal insurance on my device to cover the cost of damage or repair.

Content

1. I will use the device only to support my school learning program whilst at Gilston SS.
2. I permit my teachers and parents to perform checks to monitor that I have not installed illegal / unsuitable software applications and content and to check the websites which I visit. I understand there will be consequences for inappropriate use including, but not limited to, loss of privilege of using the device for a period of time.
3. I am responsible to ensure my device is backed up
4. Where iPad storage is low, I will prioritise school-based Apps over personal Apps

Safety and Security

1. Whilst at school, I will only connect my device to Education Queensland's Managed Internet Service. I am not permitted to access 3G Internet at school.
2. Whilst at school, I will only go to websites at school that support my learning activities.
3. I will only use my school email account for mail related to my learning.
4. I will be cyber safe and cyber smart when using the internet.
5. I will demonstrate etiquette when using my device / other equipment with regard to other people.
6. I will only take photos and record sound and video when granted permission by my teacher.
7. The school name, crest or uniform must not be used in any way which would result in a negative impact for the school and its community. I will not post photos, audio or video of such.
8. I will use my device lawfully and in accordance with the Appropriate Use/Behaviour of School Network guidelines regarding ethical use of equipment, technology, use of legal software, use of the Internet and the protection of personal data.
9. For security reasons, I am not to share account names and passwords with anyone.
10. I am responsible for the security and use of my device while at Gilston SS. Classrooms will be locked during lunch and play breaks.
11. I am aware that personal information (my email address) and work samples will be stored on my iPad. I will be vigilant when lending my iPad to family members
