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CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

ENGLISH: Students create, rehearse and present a spoken presentation on their likes and dislikes of a character in a story. They discuss character traits. Students will also be working towards writing narratives and creating original stories.

MATHEMATICS: Students are working towards locating and identifying positions of features in two-dimensional representations and move position by following directions and pathways. Students will also use a range of methods to collect, record, represent and interpret categorical data in response to questions.

SCIENCE: Students are learning about materials and their properties in order to combine different materials to create an object.

HASS: Present Connections to Places—Students will explore the following inquiry question: *How are people connected to their place and other places.*

MEDIA: Students will explore and learn how to communicate their ideas through media presentations.

SPECIALISTS

MUSIC: "Save the World"

Year 2 students will explore a range of songs, rhymes and chants based on the theme of Earth's resources as stimulus for music making and responding.

LANGUAGES: Students will begin to learn about Japan and its culture, using simple vocabulary to greet people and introduce themselves. Students will study several specific festivals held in February and March in Japan.

TECHNOLOGIES: DESIGN

Students will explore how technologies use forces to create movement in products. They will investigate spinning toys from around the world and analyse construction and movement. They will generate design ideas, using simple drawings and produce a spinning toy. Students will be asked to video their toy working and evaluate its design and production.
