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TERM 4 2024

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

ENGLISH: Students will listen to, read, view and analyse informative and literary texts. They will have opportunities to create and present a spoken procedure through decorating a biscuit based on Charlotte's Web. Students will learn to make inferences about characters and settings and draw connections between the text and their own experiences to create a narrative.

MATHEMATICS: Students will recall multiplication facts for single-digit numbers and solve multiplication problems using efficient strategies. They will model and represent unit fractions. Students will represent money values in various ways. They will correctly count out change from financial transactions.

SCIENCE: In this unit students will understand how a change of state between solid and liquid can be caused by adding or removing heat. They will explore the properties of liquids and solids and understand how to identify an object as a solid or a liquid.

HASS: Students will describe the importance of making decisions democratically and propose individual action in response to a democratic issue. They will also explain the role of rules in their community and share their views on an issue related to rule-making.

ARTS: DANCE - Improvise and structure movement ideas for dance sequences using the elements of dance and choreographic devices.

SPECIALISTS

MUSIC: "Round and Round We Go"

Year 3 students will continue to compose, perform and respond to music, exploring songs and music written in the form of round/canon. Musical examples will come from a range of countries.

LANGUAGES: Through a story study, students will be learning and practising the kanji for body parts

STEM: Digital Technologies:

Students will be introduced to a visual programming language called Scratch. Scratch uses block coding. They will be guided through a set of beginner tasks to a culmination task of their choosing.

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

In Movement, students will perform the refined fundamental movement skills of throwing, catching and balancing and apply movement concepts to solve movement challenges.

In Health, students will continue to explore risk-taking behaviours, their rights and responsibilities and decision-making strategies to help keep them safe. They explore bullying behaviours and strategies to reduce it, and identify people who can help them make good decisions and stay safe.


