| Contract School | ENGLISH: Students listen to, read, view and adapt Australian poems. They analyse texts by exploring the context, purpose and audience and how language features and language devices can be adapted to create new meaning. Students write and present to a familiar audience, an adaptation of a poem, using appropriate speaking skills. MATHEMATICS: This Term in Mathematics students will focus on building their knowledge, understanding, fluency and skills in 3 Dimensional Shapes, Maps, Symmetry, Numbers to 10000 and explore patterns of numbers and operations of Addition/ Subtraction/Multiplication and Division. They will represent money values in multiple ways counting the change and identify angles. SCIENCE: Students will use their understanding of the movement of Earth to suggest explanations for everyday observations such as day and night, sunrise and sunset and shadows. They will identify the observable and non-observable features of Earth and compare its size with the sun and moon. They will make observations of the changes in sunlight throughout the day and investigate how Earth's movement causes these changes.
