a Glance

Curriculum Overview

English

Students will read a range of imaginative texts and use these as inspiration for creating persuasive writing. They will continue developing independent reading skills while learning to express opinions clearly through both speaking and writing.

Mathematics

Students will solve multiplication and sharing problems using practical strategies. They will explore fractions including halves, quarters and eighths, measure everyday objects using informal units, and describe the features of shapes using mathematical language.

Science

Students will investigate how pushes and pulls affect the movement and shape of objects. They will make predictions, conduct simple investigations and compare their observations to explain what they discover.

HASS

Students will explore how technology has changed over time and how it has improved everyday life. They will compare life in the past with life today and consider how technology has influenced families and communities.

The Arts – Visual

Students will explore how artists represent landscapes to express ideas and feelings. They will create their own artworks using a range of techniques and explain the artistic choices they have made.
